## June Meeting: Questions and Tips for Sewing and Quilting

The aim of this is to put together many tips for experienced and newer sewers and quilters. You may think that a lot of us have sewn for many years and should know all the ins and out of sewing and quilting. Please do not voice it but be helpful by contributing.

In the meantime consider the following questions or come up with some of your own:

- How do I clean my cutting board?
- What is a clapper? How do I use it and why?
- What is a threadle and why should I use it?
- How do I clean my iron?
- Is there a correct way to put the reel of thread on the spindle?
- How to iron seams? What does it mean to set your seams?
- I often get a sore back and shoulders. How should I sit at my machine?
- When should I change the needles on my machine?
- I have trouble threading my needle
- Any tips for left handers?
- Help! I have difficulty sewing a straight line!

#### Presidential Update from Lorraine


The reason for not being able to use the door at the top of the concrete ramp to enter the hall has been clarified. I had a meeting with Sarah, the Principal and all was made clear.

That door is designated as a security EXIT. The ramp outside is NOT a disability ramp. The door works on a battery and while we kept it propped open it was running down the battery. Also as it is street side it is a security risk for those using the hall who may be engrossed and NOT notice someone slipping in.

We went out and looked at the carpark. There is a large downward slope to wheel our trolleys etc and to each side of that the steps are defined by a white line. I feel the school has done everything to prevent accidents.

There is a disability ramp through the gates at the back of the hall and while Sarah doesn't want us to park around there it is perfectly possible to drop your trolleys there and go and park. For this reason we will unlock that back door on our meeting days.

### Quilt Display at the Greenmeadows Centre, Stoke for our August Meeting

This is to be part of a week long event that is being held by the Nelson City Council to showcase different craft/art type groups in Stoke. We have been allocated a room on Saturday 19 August, the day of our monthly meeting. So the plan is :

- To have a brief Show and Tell meeting at the centre (NOT at the school hall).
- To have a display of quilted items made by our members.
- A section showing and explaining about our community quilt making. This will include a collection of pillows that are given to the children's ward. Geraldine has a big number of these.
- We will have a couple of sewing machines for the public to sew some of the pillow covers which will be cut out.
- The two quilts that were made for cancelled exhibition will be raffled at the door.
- There will be examples of the stages that are gone through to make a quilted item.
- Members will be allowed to sell quilted items but will be responsible for the selling and the handling of money. Some of you might like to group together to do this.

We are asking you to bring items that you want to display to the July meeting so we can decide what we can fit in. If you cannot come that day please contact a committee member or get someone to bring yours. Unfortunately we will not be able to hang many large quilts. A variety of items will be great. We are hoping that our display will attract some new members, so any help on the day will be greatly appreciated.

Please note that this is not a quilt show, but an excellent way of displaying of our talents to the Nelson public, and there are no costs involved.


The following link is to Whim's website: <u>www.whims.cc</u> Go to the site and then to the **Our Products page,** and then to **All Quilt Kits**.

Anne will order the kits in from the U.S. Participants will need to read the back of the pattern (when they get it) to see what they need in the way of fabric for borders, batting, backing and binding.

The cut off for Anne to order the kits is 1st July - to give time for them to get here. When they arrive, she will notify everyone, with the amount they need to pay, and give them her bank account to pay directly. Once payment has been made for all the kits, she will send them all to Alison - to give to those doing the class, so they will see on the pattern what they need - it will also list the other requirements like tools, thread etc.

STEP 1 is to look at the website and decide which kit you want.

STEP 2 is to email Anne on scottmurch1@gmail.com with your order by 1st July.


