

Whims Water Colour quilt kits workshop on Sat 9th Sept



There are spaces for about 15 participants.
There will be a cost towards hall hire and the tutor's fee. This is yet to be finalised but will not be too expensive.

Anne Murchison from Christchurch has been booked in to take this workshop. She has run them in Chch and those taking part have thoroughly enjoyed them.

Anne will order the kits in from the States. People attending the class must look on the website, www.whims.cc (instructions above) and email Anne with their request. Prices on that website are US retail, and vary from kit to kit, depending on size. For example, a common price is \$39.95US - this equates to approx \$65NZ depending on exchange rate at the time of purchase. However, Anne can get them more cheaply, and a US\$39.95 kit would cost only about NZ\$50. Everyone also will need some fusible grid, which again, she will get in and put it with the kit for an extra cost of approx \$8 - \$10. The kit includes all the small 2" squares pre-cut, and the fabric needed for any applique work and the pattern and instructions. But participants will need to read the back of the pattern (when they get it) to see what they need in the way of fabric for borders, batting, backing and binding.

The cut off for Anne to order the kits will be **1st July** - to give time for them to get here. When they arrive, she will notify everyone, with the amount they need to pay, and give them her bank account to pay directly. Once payment has been made for all the kits, she will send them all to Alison - to give to those doing the class, so they will see on the pattern what they need - it will also lists the other requirements like tools, thread etc.

STEP 1 is to look at the website and decide which kit you want.

STEP 2 is to email Anne on scottmurch1@gmail.com with your order by 1st July.
