Cost: \$20.00. It is really important that you order your preferred kit via Anne before 1st July. The class limit is about 15 people. I have included the information that was in the previous newsletters.

Anne will order the kits in from the U.S. Participants will need to read the back of the pattern (when they get it) to see what they need in the way of fabric for borders, batting, backing and binding.

The cut off for Anne to order the kits is 1st July - to give time for them to get here. When they arrive, she will notify everyone, with the amount they need to pay, and give them her bank account to pay directly. Once payment has been made for all the kits, she will send them all to Alison - to give to those doing the class, so they will see on the pattern what they need - it will also list the other requirements like tools, thread etc.

STEP 1 is to look at the website and decide which kit you want.

STEP 2 is to email Anne on scottmurch1@gmail.com with your order by 1st July.
